FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE:

Citizens **MUST** separate roadside debris as required by FEMA. If the debris is **NOT** correctly separated, the debris will not be picked up.

Orange County, City of Orange, City of Vidor, City West Orange, City of Pinehurst, City of Bridge City, Rose City and Pineforest officials are under a joint agreement with debris removal operations and are required to follow FEMA guidelines.

FEMA requires debris and damaged material to be **SEPARATED** into **FOUR DISTINCT CATEGORIES**:

- C&D Piles- construction and demolition materials
- Green ...Waste Piles- tree limbs, branches and cuttings
- White Goods- refrigerators, stoves, washers, dryers, freezers, etc.
- Hazardous Waste- paints, household chemicals, etc.

Debris must be placed **IN SEPARATE** piles to the side of the road in a manner that is **NOT** blocking the roadway in any way and should be accessible for pick up with a grappling truck.

It may take several days for debris removal to begin.
